# NEWS FROM THE PEWS

**"All things come from you, and of your own do we give you."**

One of the reminders of the pandemic in our services has been the way the **Offering** is made. Rather than pass the collection plate and bring it forward with the Communion elements for blessing, we have left it for gifts to be made before the service. However, given the importance of this part of the service, we are keen to reintroduce it, whilst still respecting the need for Covid-related caution. We will therefore be re-instituting the blessing of the elements and collection, but we will not for the moment be reintroducing the passing of the collection plate. Please note that for those who give by regular planned means (standing order or Parish Giving Scheme) or by using the card machine in Church, there are small cards available which make that clear: if you place one of these in the collection at the beginning of the service, they will be included in the blessing. We hope this will enable you to feel that your giving is fully recognised in the liturgy.

## **St Stephen's Visitors.**

One of the ways in which a number of folk at St Stephen's show their care for the community is through visiting others at home - or indeed at the local care homes. Before the pandemic, we used to meet regularly to support one another and coordinate our visiting. It would be lovely to hear from anyone who would like to get involved in this wonderful ministry, even very occasionally, so that we can get a sense of what we might be able to offer to those who approach the Church for help in this way.
