

<u>'Veiling' during Lent.</u>

You may have noticed last week that the crosses, crucifixes, statues and some other images have been covered with purple cloth. These will remain in place throughout the season of Lent until Easter. Why do we do this? 'Veiling' as it's called is an ancient tradition, although some churches do it only towards the end of Lent. It's a stark visual reminder that all the glory in our faith - which we represent through these crucifixes and images - comes only because of what Christ suffered for us. It's also a way of simplifying things so that our attention is especially focused on Jesus during these weeks. This reflects the way many people give things up during Lent, ideally to make space for a greater focus on God, and it also creates a sense of anticipation. We want the veils to be removed, and that reminds us of the glory which God has in store for us, which we long for. As St Paul said, 'Now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then we will see face to face.' (1 Corinthians 13.12)

The veils will be dramatically removed for Easter, as we celebrate with joy the resurrection of Jesus, and the hope he brings.
