Why do we cover crosses, crucifixes and statues during Lent?

As we enter the season of Lent, Christians around the world will enter with us into a time of self-examination, penitence, study and preparation for Easter. And you may have noticed that the crucifix and other statues and images around the church have been veiled with a purple cloth. The practice of veiling images alerts us that something is different and it can be rather startling at first. The veils are hard to miss and serve as a reminder to get ready! They may seem out of place, even counterintuitive and it may seem especially strange that the crucifixes are covered but through this absence of images, our senses are heightened and we become more aware of what is missing.

The images being withheld from sight build within us a sense of longing for Easter Sunday when all are unveiled before the Easter Vigil, and we are reminded that we, in a sense, live in a veiled world. It is through our own death that we are able to see our true home, and the veil is lifted. Christ lifts the veil through His Resurrection.

Jesus told her, "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. John 11:25-26
